





Join in the 13th Annual Timberland Reads Together

Timberland Reads Together is a month-long series of events held each October to promote reading and celebrate community.

This year we read or listen to the works of author Reyna Grande. Her books include *Across a Hundred Mountains* (2006), *Dancing with Butterflies* (2009), and *The Distance Between Us* (2013).

Join others in your community for book discussions, live music, and speakers.

There are more than 40 free programs and activities listed in this reader's guide along with a biography of the author, related reading suggestions, questions for thought and discussion, online resources, and additional information to enrich your experience.

Copies of the Reyna Grande's books are available to borrow from your library. Formats include print in both English and Spanish, eBook, and audiobook. *The Distance Between Us* also includes a young reader's edition in print and eBook.

The Timberland in Timberland Reads Together is all of us—everyone who lives in the five Southwest Washington counties served by TRL. Timberland is your friends, your neighbors, and your communities throughout Grays Harbor, Lewis, Mason, Pacific, and Thurston counties. Join them in reading one or more of Reyna Grande's books. Then join them at local libraries and other community gathering places for entertainment, inspiration, thoughtful ideas, and good company.

Participa en la 13ra edición anual de Timberland Reads Together

Timberland Reads Together es una serie de eventos con un mes de duración que se celebra en octubre, para promover la lectura y homenajear a la comunidad.

Este año leeremos o escucharemos fragmentos de las obras de la escritora Reyna Grande. Entre sus libros están *A través de cien montañas* (2006), *Dancing with Butterflies* (2009), y *La distancia entre nosotros* (2013). Participa junto a otros miembros de la comunidad en conversatorios sobre libros, música en vivo, y presentaciones de oradores.

En esta guía del lector encontrarás más de 40 programas y actividades gratuitas, así como una biografía de la escritora, sugerencias relacionadas con la lectura, preguntas para análisis e intercambio de opiniones, recursos por Internet, e información adicional para perfeccionar tu experiencia.

Puedes pedir prestados ejemplares de los libros de Reyna Grande en tu biblioteca. Entre los formatos disponibles hay copias impresas en inglés y español, eBooks, y audiolibros. *La distancia entre nosotros* también cuenta con una edición para jóvenes lectores en versión impresa y eBook.

The Timberland in Timberland Reads Together nos incluye a todos los que residimos en los cinco condados de Southwest Washington a los que presta servicios TRL. Timberland incluye a tus amigos, vecinos y comunidades de los condados Grays Harbor, Lewis, Mason, Pacific, y Thurston. Participa junto a ellos en la lectura de uno o más libros de Reyna Grande. Luego también podrás visitar las bibliotecas locales y otros sitios de reunión comunitaria, y disfrutar de entretenimiento, inspiración, ideas significativas y buena compañía.

Questions for Thought & Discussion

Questions (developed by Simon & Shuster) based on Reyna Grande's memoir *The Distance Between Us*.

- 1 What does Grande's memoir tell us about the struggles of students for whom English is their second language?
- 2 *The Distance Between Us* is a memoir. Are there any characteristics of this memoir that you can identify with?
- 3 Compare and contrast Mago's experiences as a student in Mexico and the United States. What drives her to succeed despite her challenges?
- 4 Despite her on-again off-again relationship with her father, Reyna yearns to make her father proud. In what ways did this desire serve her well? In what ways did it not?
- 5 How do Reyna's perceptions of her mother evolve with time?
- 6 How might this story be different if it was from another character's point of view (e.g.: Mago, Carlos, either parent, or either grandparent)?
- 7 When Reyna returns to Iguala to visit her family, how does she reflect on her youth living in Mexico? How do her attitudes differ from those of her sister Mago? What accounts for their differences?
- 8 Compare and contrast the ways in which Reyna, Mago, and Carlos deal with the on-again off-again relationships with their parents?
- 9 As Reyna matures into a young woman, how does she resolve her feelings of abandonment by both her mother and father? Does she view one parent as having been the better parent? Why or why not?
- 10 How does this novel contribute to a growing body of literature about immigration to the United States?

Preguntas para análisis e intercambio de opiniones

Preguntas (creadas por la editorial Simon & Schuster) inspiradas en el libro de memorias *La distancia entre nosotros* de Reyna Grande.

- 1** ¿Qué nos cuenta el libro de memorias de Reyna Grande sobre las dificultades que confrontan los estudiantes para los que el inglés es un segundo idioma?
- 2** *La distancia entre nosotros* es un libro de memorias. ¿Hay algunas características de la misma con las que puedes identificarte?
- 3** Compara y contrasta las experiencias de Mago como estudiante en México y en los Estados Unidos. ¿Qué la inspira a triunfar a pesar de los retos que enfrenta?
- 4** A pesar de la conflictiva relación que tiene con su padre, Reyna se esfuerza en hacer que éste se enorgullezca de ella. ¿En qué forma la beneficia este deseo? ¿Y en qué la perjudica?
- 5** ¿Cómo evoluciona con el tiempo el concepto que tiene Reyna de su madre?
- 6** ¿Cómo podría ser diferente esta historia desde el punto de vista de otro personaje (por ejemplo: Mago, Carlos, el padre, la madre, la abuela, el abuelo)?
- 7** Cuando Reyna regresa a Iguala para visitar a su familia, ¿cómo reflexiona sobre su juventud en México? ¿Cómo difieren sus actitudes con respecto a las de su hermana Mago? ¿Cuáles son sus diferencias?
- 8** Compara y contrasta las maneras en las cuales Reyna, Mago y Carlos asumen las relaciones conflictivas que tienen con sus padres.
- 9** En la medida que Reyna va madurando y convirtiéndose en una joven, ¿cómo resuelve sus sentimientos de abandono por parte de su madre y su padre? ¿Considera que uno ha sido mejor con ella que el otro? ¿Por qué?, o ¿Por qué no?
- 10** ¿Cómo contribuye esta novela a un conjunto de obras literarias sobre la inmigración a los Estados Unidos?
